The Feast of the Annunciation

March 25

Today, we remember that the Angel Gabriel announced to Mary that God had chosen her to be the mother of his son, Jesus. Read the account in Luke 1:26-38.

Patrick decided to become a priest and he was later ordained a bishop.



Patrick walked a long way to the coast, and managed to hide away on a boat that was going to Britain.



Patrick was very lonely during this time and he prayed to God every day and every night.

SACRED SITES OF ST. PATRICK IN IRELAND

Lough Derg, Co. Donegal:

Legend has it that St. Patrick had a vision of the afterlife while in a cave on an island in Lough Derg in Co. Donegal. Other Irish saints like St. Daveoc also visited the island, and it became a place of pilgrimage. Today people travel during the summer months for three days of fasting, and praying giving up their sleep and their shoes and socks!! Slane, Co. Meath:

After Patrick had escaped and left Ireland he had a dream in which he was told to return to Ireland. In the dream the angel told him to return and tell the people the good news about God. Patrick trained as a priest before his return. When he did return in the year 432 AD, he lit the first Easter fire on the Hill of Slane.

The Rock of Cashel

The Rock of Cashel is in Co Tipperary. It is also known as St Patrick's Rock, Carraig Phádraig. It was here that Patrick is said to have baptised Aenghus, the King of Munster in the 5th Century. You can find more information at www.cashel.ie

Croagh Patrick, Co. Mayo

Croagh Patrick, overlooks Clew Bay in County Mayo, and it is considered the holiest mountain in Ireland. In 441 AD Patrick spent 40 days fasting on the top of this mountain. Each year about 1 million pilgrims climb Croagh Patrick. On 'Reek Sunday', the last Sunday in July, there are over 25,000 pilgrims on the mountain. This is adapted from Luke 1:26-38. You can also read it in the class bible.

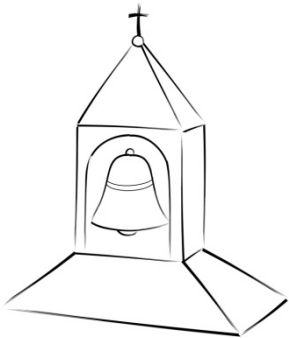

One day an angel called Gabriel visited Mary and said 'Greetings, most favoured one, and do not be afraid. God has chosen you among all women. Very soon you will have a baby, you must call him Jesus.' This was to be a very special baby. He would be great, and his kingdom would last forever. He told her that the child would be called Son of God. Mary was very afraid but Gabriel told her not to be. He said that the Holy Spirit would fill her and would give her courage and strength. Mary bowed before the angel Gabriel and told him that she would do as God wished. When she got up the Angel had gone. After receiving this news, Mary heard that her Cousin Elizabeth was also going to have a baby and she went to visit her. When she reached the house of Elizabeth the two women praised God and Mary sang these words.

The Angelus Bell Calls us to Pray

Every day at 12.00 noon and 6.00pm the Church Bell announces the Angelus. We hear it on RTE radio and television. We have been praying the Angelus for a very long time, about 700 years. It reminds us of when God sent the Angel Gabriel to Mary. The angel told Mary that she was to become a mother and that the baby would be the Son of God. The prayer also helps us to remember and say thanks that Mary said 'yes' and did what God had asked her to do.
