# Lenten Catechesis to be made available to all parishes: *Sunday Mass – Digging Deeper*

The Sunday Mass is at the heart of who we are as Christians. This Lent Bishop Denis is inviting parishioners across the diocese to engage in reflecting on the Sunday Mass so that we can deepen our appreciation of its sacredness and, also, deepen our own understanding of and participation in the Mass.

Working with Bishop Denis, the Diocesan Commission for Liturgical Formation is preparing a menu of resources exploring the Sunday Mass that will be available to parishes for use this Lent. These resources will be rolled out from Sunday, March 10 to Sunday April 6 and beyond.

Following a letter and video of invitation from Bishop Denis on Sunday March 10, the set of resources will explore a different part of the Mass each week: The Introductory Rites (March 17); The Liturgy of the Word (March 24); The Liturgy of the Eucharist (March 31); The Concluding Rites (April 6).

## What will be on offer for each week...

- Homily Notes for preachers
- A short *iCatholic* video for each part of the Mass for use in the home or among parish groups
- An A<sub>4</sub> double sided handout for distribution with the parish newsletter and for parish websites, social media accounts and notice boards
- *Signposts on the Road to Emmaus an Exploration of the Mass* This four week programme is being offered as a Lenten course for parishioners

## Signposts on the Road to Emmaus – An Exploration of the Mass

This series, written by Julie Kavanagh and published by Veritas, explores the Mass over four 1.5 hour sessions. Each session explores to a part of the Mass through the lens of: – our human experience – the story of Jesus and the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus – the Sunday Experience of Mass - and its actual celebration.

### The Diocesan Commission for Liturgical Formation

would like to thank all those parishes that completed and returned the recent survey on local Baptism and Initiation practices.

The Commission is considering the findings. Among other things, it is hoped that such shared reflection will result in greater resources and supports being available to parishes. The Commission is also looking to what happens when adults seek full initiation or reception into the Catholic Church, again with the aim of offering helpful supports and resources for parishes.

**PRAY AS YOU GO** is a daily prayer session, designed for use on portable devices, to help you pray whenever you find time, but particularly whilst travelling to and from work, study, etc. A new prayer session is produced every day of the working week and one session for the weekend. It is not a 'Thought for the Day', a sermon or a bible

study, but rather a framework for your own prayer. It is founded in Ignatian Spirituality and uses the imagination to enter more deeply into prayer. Lasting between ten and thirteen minutes, it combines music, scripture and some questions for reflection.

The aim of the app is to help you to: \*become more aware of God's presence in your life \*listen to and reflect on God's word \*grow in your relationship with God



It is produced by Jesuit Media Initiatives, with material written by a number of Jesuits, both in Britain and further afield, and other experts in the spirituality of St Ignatius of Loyola. Although the content is different every day, it keeps to the same basic format.
