Parishioners across the diocese will receive their Reach Out 2019 Christmas Gift from the Parish and Message from Bishop Denis on the weekend of the Third Sunday of Advent, December 15.

Central to Reach Out this year is the call to *'Share with the Hungry'*. As we get ready to welcome Christ once more at Christmas, in the true spirit of Christian outreach, we are being invited to bring the love of Christ to others.





The gift this year is a trolley coin fob that also carries the Reach Out message. As we shop this Christmas and throughout the year, may the fob remind us of those less fortunate than ourselves and our Christian calling to support them in concrete ways. Parish initiatives such as St Clare's

Hospitality, Graiguecullen, Share Food Appeal in Newbridge and Portlaoise Action Towards the Homeless (PATH), as well as others, need our support to continue their great work.



In a particular way this Advent, the diocese is highlighting the importance of the work of St Vincent de Paul and asking that people support this year's annual appeal as generously as they can locally.

We can mark this time in parishes and personally by:


