3. Mary entrusts herself completely to the Word of God. In a few moments of silence we entrust ourselves to God's love.

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# Hearing Happening Hoping

## Keeping AWAKE with Scripture this Advent

### Week 4 ~ Luke 1:26-38



**The Word of God comes to us to awaken our hearts. We begin by praying:** God our Father, source of all light, you have sent your Son into the world, to reveal yourself to all your children. Send your Spirit upon us now, that we may meet Jesus in the Word that comes from you. May we come to know him, may we come to love him more deeply and so be drawn closer to the happiness of your Kingdom. Amen.

### **Luke 1:26-38**

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Hail, O favoured one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the word, and wondered what sort of greeting this might be.

And the angel said to her, "Be not afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And behold, you will conceive in the womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How shall this be, since I have no husband?" And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible."

And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

### **HEARING ~ *Speak Lord, your servants are listening!* You have the words of eternal life!**

*We read the passage 2-3 times. Reflect and share on **some** of the following:*

1. How does Mary react to the angel's approach and greeting? What emotions well up in her?



2. What is Mary's response to the angel?

3. How would you describe Mary's final response? Is it a response of courage or resignation? Or is it a response of fear, of trust, or of desperation?

### **HAPPENING ~ *Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.* This Scripture happens in our own lives and in the world around us**

*We read the passage again and reflect on **some** of the following:*

1. "... *she was greatly troubled at the word ...*" When have we felt the Lord drawing close, and been disturbed by the Lord's closeness?

2. "*Be not afraid Mary...*"

The angel reassures Mary that God's hand is in what will unfold in her life. How has the Lord opened your eyes and heart to the possibility of his way?



3. "*How shall this be..?*" When have we found ourselves questioning what God was doing to us? Did our questions resolve themselves? If so, how? If not, what blocks did we encounter?

4. "*With God, nothing will be impossible!*" When have you seen God go beyond people's expectations and hopes? In a moment of forgiveness? In a new beginning? Consolation in the face of unimaginable loss?
