#### **Three Year Safeguarding Plan**

2022 - 2025

#### Introduction

This is the third Three Year Diocesan Safeguarding Plan aimed at ensuring that Safeguarding Policy and Standards are implemented in the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin. In 2016 the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin adopted the Safeguarding Children Policy and Standards for the Catholic Church in Ireland which were developed by the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland. The diocese also has a Policy on the Safeguarding of Vulnerable Adults which was last reviewed in 2021.

This plan was agreed by the Kildare and Leighlin Safeguarding Committee on September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022. This plan is for a period of three years and will be reviewed annually or sooner as needed with for example changes in Policy or Guidance by the National Board. The diocese commits to providing the resources for example staffing and delivery of training programmes required to implement this strategic plan. The plan is written using the 2016 Safeguarding Children Policy and Standards for the Catholic Church in Ireland and where relevant are applied for vulnerable adults also.

We wish to acknowledge the commitment of people throughout the Diocese who promote the welfare of children and vulnerable adults and who endeavour to ensure their safety and welfare in all their involvement with the life of the Church. We acknowledge and value that church personnel and volunteers now see safeguarding as an integral part of their ministry and their role in the church. We welcome feedback on this Plan and on all aspects of Diocesan safeguarding arrangements.
