

ADVENT EVENING PRAYER IN THE PARISH:

NOTES AND ALTERNATIVE

HYMNS, READINGS AND INTERCESSIONS

STRUCTURE OF THE CELEBRATION:

	POSTURE
 Greeting (Leader makes Sign of Cross)	<i>stand</i>
 Advent Hymn (The leader can place incense on coals during this hymn)	<i>stand</i>
 Two Psalms (see note below)	<i>sit</i>
 Scripture reading (only text of reading is proclaimed)	<i>sit</i>
 Magnificat (Sign of Cross is made on opening phrase; incense can be placed on coals during this Gospel canticle)	<i>stand</i>
 Intercessions	<i>stand</i>
 The Lord's prayer	<i>stand</i>
 Concluding prayer	<i>stand</i>
 Conclusion of the hour (Leader makes Sign of Cross)	<i>stand</i>

PRAYING THE PSALMS:

The recitation of the psalms can be done in a variety of ways, for example men and women on alternate verses, prayer leader/cantor and congregation taking alternate verses or congregation divided into two sides. People should be instructed as to how this will be done before the prayer begins.

MINISTERS NEEDED

-  Prayer leader
-  Reader for scripture reading (The reader does not proclaim, A Reading From... or The Word of the Lord)
-  Reader for intercessions
-  Song leader / instrumentalist to lead people in singing the opening hymn, as well as the Magnificat and any of the psalms, if they are being sung.

SET UP

-  A chair and standing microphone for the prayer leader.
-  Microphone switched on at ambo.
-  Lighting and heating as necessary in the church.
-  A prayer leaflet for participants.
-  Standing microphone if needed for song leader.
-  Appropriate number of lights already lit on Advent wreath.
-  Candles can be lighting by the altar and the ambo.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Week One:

Philippians 3:20b-21

Week Four:

A shoot shall grow from the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall spring from his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him, a spirit of wisdom and understanding a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.

INTERCESSIONS

Set One:

Reader:

Lift up those who are struggling with addictions and those in any kind of trouble.

Set Two:

Prayer leader: My brothers and sisters, as we prepare for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us earnestly ask his mercy. He came into the world to preach good news to the poor and to heal the repentant sinner. Let us ask him to come again to our world today, bringing salvation to all who stand in need.

That the Lord Jesus may be with his Church and guide it always, we pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

That the Lord may bless the world with his peace and the protection of his love, we pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

That the Lord Jesus may heal the sick, rid the world of hunger, and protect us from all disasters, we pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, have mercy.

That the Lord may find us watching and ready at his coming, we pray to the Lord.
