


Diocesan Synod Team Issue Report and Video from Lenten Synod Listening Sessions

The REPORT from our Lenten listening sessions is now available to read on www.Kandle.ie/synod. There you will also find a five minute VIDEO summary of its content. We invite you to take a look at both of these communications to find out what people in our diocese said. The findings give invaluable insights to us at this point in future planning in our diocese and parishes.

The report was sent to the National Synod Team and was carefully considered, alongside submissions from diocese and church groups from across Ireland, over a two day meeting in May.

The National Synod Team will work with delegates from every diocese at a national presynodal assembly in October to determine the themes to progress to a Synodal Assembly in 2026.

County Carlow will play host to a major international celebration this summer, as over 250 visitors from France, Italy, Germany and Northern Ireland, along with many more from local counties, will arrive for the 26th Columbanus Weekend, taking place from 11th to 13th July 2025.

The weekend's programme will highlight Carlow's spiritual, cultural and historical connections to the saint, with events taking place in Carlow Town and Myshall. The recently established Columban Way, a 571km walking route inspired by Columbanus' journey from County Carlow to Bangor in County Down, also features prominently. On Saturday morning, pilgrims will walk a section of the route from the Nine Stones on Mount Leinster to Myshall, based on the theme of "Walking Together in Hope."

PREPARATION IN FINAL STAGES FOR LAY PASTORAL MINISTERS TRAINING



Since January, candidates for the Diploma in Lay Pastoral Ministry have met monthly in Mount St Anne's in a process of discernment. This included two residential weekends. In that time people bonded as a group as they explored different aspects of faith and lay pastoral ministry. In the coming weeks, candidates will decide with the diocese whether or not to proceed to training.

Plans are in place to register our students in St Patrick's College, Maynooth on the 5th of September with the first residential weekend of training and study scheduled for 12th to 14th September.



Pastoral Placements will play a key part of the students' training. From the start, they will be encouraged to reflect and gain insights from their pastoral experiences. To support this, a number of facilitators from Kildare and Leighlin joined with facilitators from the Kilmore Diocese for three days of training in Reflective Practice Facilitation with Dr Michael Paterson.



The Biblical text for this year is Isaiah 32:14-18. The prophet Isaiah pictured the desolated Creation without peace because of the lack of justice and the broken relationship between God and humankind. This description of devastated cities and wastelands eloquently stresses the fact that human destructive behaviours have a negative impact on the Earth.

Our hope: Creation will find peace when justice is restored.

There is still hope and the expectation for a peaceful Earth. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and be quiet, but to act, pray, change, and reconcile with Creation and the Creator in unity, metanoia (repentance), and solidarity.
